



COVID-19 Update March 25th, 2020.

Dear Westmount Park Towers Co-owners,

Following our latest communication regarding COVID-19 on March 23rd, please read below for some important updates with regards to this ongoing evolving situation.

Obligation to report confirmed or suspected cases of COVID-19

- Once again, we remind you that all those in self-isolation or quarantine, who have a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19, must immediately advise Jean Denis Anjou at the front desk or email Francine Marcoux. The identity of the persons concerned will not be disclosed.
- If you are currently being tested for COVID-19 and are awaiting results, you must stay in your condo unit and not come out for any reason. You can only come out when you no longer have any symptom. Should you test positive to the COVID-19, you will have to stay in your condo-unit until you receive 2 negative tests and a medical certificate attesting to it.

Community-based measures in effect:

- **Important Update as of March 26th,(midnight) : Prime Minister Trudeau and Premier Legault have announced that everyone who have returned from abroad i.e. outside of Montreal must self isolate for 14 days. You must respect the Quebec Government requirements TO STAY HOME IN YOUR CONDO UNIT for the entire 14 days. You are not to leave your condo unit for any reason. You must comply with all of these latest measures as it is the only way to stop the spread of this virus and protect all of our community.**

To protect your health, people 70 years of age and over are asked to stay home, except in cases of necessity or exceptional circumstances.

Respect the rule of social distance of 6' between you and all other persons at all times. Please refrain from socializing with other co-owners in hallways or lobby or the mailroom.

- If you are self-isolating and are in need of help with bringing up your mail and deliveries, with removal of garbage from your unit, please call the front desk and leave a message for Jean Denis with the doorman. We will try to assist you as best we can. If you have family in Montreal, they can drop off food at your door while respecting social distance. There are many food stores and restaurants that will deliver food.
- **Important: Under no circumstances should co-owners exercise, by walking back and forth on their own floors or going from floor to floor, going up and down the staircases. It is important to understand that you can be infected with the virus and not have any symptoms. Yet, if you are exercising in the hallways, you will be shedding the virus on the floors and infecting others. Please be vigilant as to not contaminate anybody and respect the health of all your co-owners**
- Although we had encouraged co-owners to use staircases in our previous communication, we have been advised that **the staircases are to be used only in case of an emergency evacuation.**
- No more than 2 people in the elevators at any given time in order to permit sufficient spacing between individuals.
- If you have caregivers coming to care for you or a family member, please take extreme measure to protect yourself and them.
- With the closure of non-essential businesses as of March 25th, any non-urgent work related to maintenance, repairs and renovations must be rescheduled for a future date.
- Dog walkers will not be allowed into the building. Should you be using such a service, please bring your dog to the outside lobby
- With Easter and Passover coming up, we would like to remind you that indoor and outdoor gatherings are banned. This means no guests for those celebrations this year.
- We thank Jean-Denis and his staff who are working so diligently to keep us all healthy. Their health is a priority and is fundamental to our safety. They want to continue to be present and help you out. They will do their utmost to assist you but we ask you to help them out by keeping your distance, (2 meters) to keep them safe. A temporary plexi-glass frame has been installed

as well as red tape around the doorman's desk to prevent anyone touching the plexi-glass.

- Many thanks to Jean Denis who has built all the stands to house sanitizer bottles on each floor and in the common areas. Please, these sanitizing bottles are here for the entire community to use and not to be taken off these stands and into your condo unit.
- Again, we strongly encourage all co-owners and essential visitors to WPT to sanitize their hands upon entering, before touching any surfaces or handles and upon exiting WPT.

At this time, respecting these additional measures is of crucial importance in reducing your own risk of infection and in flattening the curve. We understand that these are difficult and uncertain times, and we thank you for your continued support, patience and collaboration.

We will update you as needed.
